

The global economy is still in recovery mode. After a solid Q1, which saw the US and China expand further, and the UK and eurozone come out of recession, activity levels remain on the up for both the manufacturing and services sectors, although the momentum for the former is slowing. The rebound in global industry is not matched by the consumer outlook, however. Household spending is subdued, a trend that is also enveloping the US now, and supports the view that global growth will be slightly below trend in 2024, at around 3%. Political factors (the spate of upcoming elections) also overhang the growth outlook, as a Trump presidency could trigger inflationary, growth-sapping tariffs. On the monetary easing side, two of the big players – the US and UK – have held off so far. And whereas the ECB went ahead with its June rate cut, it immediately cautioned about further moves, suggesting this could be a once-off event. Global equities (MSCI All World Index) were up a hefty 3%, representing more than the quarter's gain (2.5%). The performance was very concentrated though, driven mainly by the US. The S&P500 was up 3.5% in June but this itself was powered by just a small number of mega-cap tech companies, as more than three quarters of individual companies declined. To underline the point, the tech-heavy Nasdaq was up 6% in June.

Transaction Costs (TC%): The Transaction Costs (TC) is the percentage of the net asset value of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the buying and selling of the assets underlying the Financial Product.

Total Investment Charges TIC (%) = TER (%) + TC (%): The Total Investment Charges (TIC), the TER + the TC, is the percentage of the net asset value of the class of the Financial Product incurred as costs relating to the investment of the Financial Product.
