Investment objective

The Sub-fund aims to provide long-term capital growth by investing in a wide range of asset classes and by offering a balanced exposure to equity and fixed income markets. The Sub-fund may invest, mainly through funds and worldwide, in equities, fixed-income instruments (such as bonds, notes and convertibles, including, on an ancillary basis, high yield, subordinated and inflation-linked bonds), as well as, to a lesser extent, in instruments offering exposure to commodities.

Risk/Return profile



The SRI (Synthetic Risk Indicator) is the indicator from the ESMA that replaced the SRRI on 1st January 2023. The SRI is calculated as the combination of MRM (Market Risk Measure) and CRM (Credit Risk Measure). Considering that the CRM scores the issuer default risk, which is extremely unlikely on a UCITS Product, the MRM will be the main trigger of the SRI score. The MRM (so the SRI) is a representation of the Market risk of the share class based on historical data (measured or proxied to a similar market risk) over the recommended holding period, unless stated otherwise.

The SRI will have a value from 1 (less volatile) to 7 (highly volatile).

Manager Comment

Highlights

- Positive month for both bonds and equities thanks to positive signs of interest rates cut
- Wide dispersion among regions / styles / sectors, large dominance of US / Growth / IT
- The economic environment remains broadly supportive for equity and fixed income assets

Market Review

June was a positive month for both bonds and equities as rate cuts were increasingly in focus. Indeed, first interest-rates cut initiated by several Central Banks and the low May US CPInumber released in June helped to support financial markets.

In this context, US interest rates decreased, and credit spreads slightly widened especially in the HY and EM debt space over the month. Global equity performed well with somedistinction depending on the region. Emerging Market and US equities (thanks to The Magnificent 7 names), strongly performed, followed by Japan. However, European equities endedthe month in the red, partly due to French assets 'selloff following E. Macron's announcement of a snap election. Chinese equities suffered as well. Gold was flat over the month. JPYand EUR depreciated against the USD while CHF gained ground.

Fund Review

The fund posted a positive performance in June, as both equity and bonds contributed to the performance. The equity allocation was the main contributor to the performance. Theexposure to US market was the largest positive contributor due to its size and thanks to the security selection, with Amazon, Microsoft and Alphabet gaining more than +5% over themonth. Very solid performances of the Global Semiconductors ETF and the MSCI Asia ETF, as the latter has a 40% exposure to Taiwan and South Korea, markets with large semiexposure. The bond allocation brought a positive performance contribution as both credit and government bond bucket contributed positively to the performance in a context of decreasing USD interest rates. Gold and alternative strategy were a marginal positive contributor. Unhedged FX exposure was a detractor to the performance in a context of weakerJPY and EUR against USD. There was no change in the allocation of the portfolio over the month.

Outlook

The economic environment remains broadly supportive for risk assets as global growth is stabilizing on a moderate but positive pace. Europe and China are set to continue recoveringafter the weakness experienced in 2023, while the US economy is losing some momentum but continues to grow close to its trend rate. Indeed, the slowdown in US consumption, inparallel of a less buoyant labor market, may finally be what the Fed has been aiming at by tightening its monetary policy, as it will likely ease underlying inflationary pressures and allowfor some rate cuts later this year and in 2025. In this context, equity markets will remain supported by solid EPS growth, while valuations will benefit from less restrictive monetaryconditions. On the fixed income side, milder inflationary pressures and slowing economic growth lower the risks of further increases in longterm rates. In this environment, long-termbonds can also bring useful portfolio diversification in case of an unexpected deterioration in economic and market conditions, while short-to-medium term bonds remain the mostattractive part of the fixed income market for the time being given the level of yield.

Highest & Lowest return: The highest and lowest returns for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Alpha: Denoted the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark. Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average. Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

Max Gain: Largest increase in any single month % Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

Average Duration: The weighted average duration of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund. Average Credit quality: The weighted average credit quality of all the underlying interest bearing instruments in the Fund (internally calculated).
