

Investment objective

The Maestro Equity Prescient Fund will be a general equity portfolio. The Manager in selecting securities for the portfolio will seek to follow an investment policy which will secure for investors an optimum overall return, that is to say the steady growth of income and the preservation of capital in real terms. In order to achieve these main objectives, the investments to be acquired for the Maestro Equity Prescient Fund, shall comprise a mix of securities, financially sound ordinary shares, stock, financially sound preference shares, debenture stock, debenture bonds and unsecured notes as defined in the Act and the Deed, all to be acquired at a fair market value.

The Fund benchmark

The Fund will measure itself against the FTSE-JSE All Share Index. ASISA Classification: South African-Equity-General.

Legal structure

The Fund is a scheme in the nature of a trust known as a collective investment scheme. The portfolio manager is Maestro Investment Management (Pty) Ltd, an approved Financial Services Provider in terms of the Financial Advisory and Intermediany Services Act, operating under license number 739. This portfolio operates as a white label fund under the Prescient unit Trust Scheme, which is governed by the Collective Investment Schemes Control Act.

Fee structure

The maximum initial fee is 2.0%. The annual investment management fee is 1.75%. The annual total expense ratio (TER) for period ended 30 June 2024, in respect of class A was 2.28%.

Market Overview

You may recall that we described July as a "traumatic month" in the markets. August didn't start off very well either; the first three trading days saw the US and German equity markets down 6.6% and 6.3%, respectively. However, favourable – at least for lower interest rates – inflation, retail sales, and labour market data out of the US calmed nerves. Consequently, bond and equity markets stabilized and moved higher during the remainder of the month.

The Bloomberg Global Aggregate Bond index rose 2.4%, which, after July's 2.8% return pulled the year-to-date global bond return into positive territory, at 1.9%. While encouraging, this is still far behind the comparable return from global equity markets, which has risen to 15.5%. The US equity market has risen 19.5% and the NASDAQ, which lead most of the recovery last year and into the early part of 2024, has risen 18.0% over the same period. The breadth of the market rise is now more broad-based than a few months ago, which is a positive indicator of the strength and resilience of global equity markets in general, and US equity markets in particular.


The US equity market rose 2.4% and the German market 2.2%, helping the MSCI World index to a monthly gain of 2.5%. The Japanese market lost 1.2%, and the Chinese markets ended 3.3% lower. The MSCI Emerging markets index rose 1.4%. The dollar weakened during August, losing 2.3%, as the prospect of lower US interest rates became increasingly likely. Its weakness had a positive effect of the commodity price complex; the gold and palladium prices ended up 5.4% and 7.2% respectively, but the oil price ended down 3.9% and has now fallen 9.8% during the past year.

Local market returns

The rand rose 2.5% against the dollar during August, which supported companies focused on the local economy but hurt the commodity producers. The Basic Material index lost 9.9% during the month but the Financial and Industrial indices rose 5.3% and 4.0% respectively. The All Share ended the month 1.4% higher. The Large, Mid and Small Cap indices rose 1.0%, 0.5%, and 5.4% respectively. The bond market benefitted from the firm rand and strong global bond markets, ending up 2.4% in August, bringing its year-to-date return to 12.3%, higher than the All Share index's comparable 11.4% return.

Investment Manager comment

During August, the *Maestro Equity Prescient Fund rose* 0.1% versus the 1.4% rise in the All Share index. In the face of the rand's 2.5% rise against the dollar, the Fund's large (33.3%) offshore exposure retarded the returns during the month. The Fund's 7.6% holding in the Satrix Resource ETF lost 9.1% (remember the Basic Material index lost 9.9%). Afrimat lost 3.7% and Billiton 2.9%. Not surprisingly, the Fund's exposure to financial shares served it well; Capitec rose 3.2%, Firstrand 5.2%, Discovery 7.1%, and Standard

Bank 8.2%. Hudaco and Stor-Age rose 9.2% and 4.2% respectively.


There were no material changes to the Fund's portfolio during August.

The Fund adhered to its Policy objective during the month.




Historic sector allocation (% of Equity)
