The Fund will aim to deliver returns in excess of the benchmark over a long term time horizon.

INVESTMENT POLICY

The fund aims to achieve this by investing predominantly into global equities. This is performed through active and unconstrained management in both South African and foreign markets with a focus on equity opportunities within the offshore markets. The Fund will, apart from assets in liquid form, consist solely of participatory interest in Collective Investment Schemes which will invest in a diversified mix of assets, including but not limited to equities, property, preference shares, money market and fixed interest instruments. The underlying collective investment schemes are permitted to invest in listed and unlisted financial instruments in line with conditions as determined by legislation from time to time. The Fund will adhere to investment conditions determined by legislation from time to time.

FUND COMMENTARY

Emerging markets outperformed developed markets in Q2, bolstered by strength in some Asian economies and stocks tied to artificial intelligence (AI). The European Central Bank cut interest rates, though inflation concerns kept other major central banks on hold.

US: US equities rose, led by information technology and communication services sectors, fuelled by ongoing enthusiasm around AI. Financials gained as several banks announced dividend increases. The Federal Reserve's latest "dot plot" indicated just one rate cut this year. US inflation slightly eased, while the labor market remained robust.

Eurozone: Eurozone shares declined due to political uncertainty in France and tempered expectations for further rate cuts. The ECB cut interest rates by 25 basis points, but sticky inflation may limit additional cuts. Economic recovery showed signs of slowing, with PMI data indicating marginal growth.

UK: UK equities hit record highs, supported by small and mid-sized companies. Despite a strong economic rebound in Q1, growth stagnated in April, and unemployment rose. Inflation hit the BoE's target for the first time since 2021, but concerns about wage-driven inflation persisted.

Asia: Japanese equities gained in yen terms but fell in foreign currency terms due to yen depreciation. Strong earnings reports and record-high tourist spending supported the market, though conservative future earnings guidance weighed on sentiment. Meanwhile, solid gains were observed in Taiwan, India, and Singapore. Low valuations in China attracted cautious investors, while AI optimism boosted Taiwanese stocks. Political stability and strong economic data supported Indian equities.

Emerging Markets: Emerging market equities outperformed, driven by softer US economic data and a Chinese rebound. Turkey, Taiwan, and South Africa performed well, while political developments supported markets in India and South Africa.

Outlook and Portfolio Strategy

Global markets continue to face uncertainty amidst continued geopolitical tensions. This is also bolstered by political uncertainty and change in many major regions. Tapering global inflation along with potential interest rate cuts in the new future continues to provide the market with optimism.

Our diversified portfolio strategy is designed to navigate these global geopolitical trends. We maintain exposure to a diverse range of shares and regions. Continually looking for undervalued businesses with strong economic moats. This balanced approach aims to optimize opportunities and manage risks effectively.

GLOSSARY

Fund of Funds: A Fund of Funds is a portfolio that invests in portfolios of collective investment schemes, which levy their own charges, which could result in a higher fee structure for these portfolios

Annualised performance: Annualised performance shows longer term performance rescaled to a 1 year period. Annualised performance is the average return per year over the period.

Highest & Lowest performance: The highest and lowest performance for any 1 year over the period since inception have been shown.

NAV: The net asset value represents the assets of a Fund less its liabilities.

Current Yield: Annual income (interest or dividends) divided by the current price of the security.

CPU: Cents Per Unit to the Glossary

Alpha: Denotes the outperformance of the fund over the benchmark.

Sharpe Ratio: The Sharpe ratio is used to indicate the excess return the portfolio delivers over the risk free rate per unit of risk adopted by the fund.

Standard Deviation: The deviation of the return stream relative to its own average.

Max Drawdown: The maximum peak to trough loss suffered by the Fund since inception.

% Positive Month: The percentage of months since inception where the Fund has delivered positive return.

FUND SPECIFIC RISK

Default Risk: The risk that the issuers of fixed income instruments may not be able to meet interest payments nor repay the money they have borrowed. The issuers credit quality is vital. The worse the credit quality, the greater the risk of default and therefore investment loss.
